Control in educational management is a process of regulating activities according to the objectives of education. It is essential for directing efforts of an institution towards the achievement of educational objectives. Control as a part of educational management deals with any deviance between planned performance and actual performance. Control is based on accurate, up-to-date and credible information about the performance of groups or persons working in an institution.

Ans: Organization involves division of work among employees, grouping of closely related activities, assigning duties and responsibilites to the employees and delegating authority and power to each employee or the group to discharge their duties. Organization in educational management aims at effective teamwork towards the achievement of educational objectives. Organization is a continuous process which is characterized by coordination and division of work among different personnel, group or departments of an educational institution.
